2 BRIEF FACTUAL OVERVIEW

The main developments that happened in the "Study Fund" project were region ones. The eruption of the 2nd Intifada created a new environment to implement the studies. Ministries have been operating under a backdrop of instability in the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Circumstances have continued to change. Elections took place at the beginning of 2006 which had an effect on the entire country and the way other countries deal with Palestine. Also due to the elections and new government, two cabinets were formed within less than 15 months.

3 OVERVIEW OF ACTIVITY PLANNING

3.1 Activity overview

A study and consultancy fund, jointly managed by Palestinian partners and BTC, is a tool to finance preparatory steps to further projects. The study fund was launched in 2001 and kept on-going till now. Noticeable progress has been noted and identification studies have been conducted in different sectors as can be seen in the activities below. This fund is needed and BTC recommends make it sustainable in spite of the difficulties listed below.

Five studies have been carried out since the inception of the project until now. These studies have been formulated, implemented and followed up. The total expenses of these studies are 89.923 Euro and the actual remaining balance is 160.077 Euro.

The studies that have been conducted are:

- Streamlining of Public Health Training.
- Identification Study for "Capacity Building and Institutional Development Support to the Ministry of Planning" - Phase II
- Identification Study for Technical and Vocational Education Training in Palestine
- Identification & formulation "Neonatology at Shifa Hospital in Gaza"
- Identification Study for the "Reinforcement of the Tertiary Health Care".

In December, 2007, a new study was approved for "Enhancement of Civil Protection and Emergency Services" (35.000 €). The study is expected to start in 2008.

3.2 Analysis of activity planning

In 2007, one new study was approved and foreseen for implementation in 2008. The low number of studies conducted through this fund is partially due to the overload of the Ministry of Planning during the past year and the continuous changes caused in the different line ministries. BTC plans to work more closely with Ministry of Planning in 2008 to encourage more proposals to be implemented through the study fund.

Some of the Key difficulties/problems faced by the project included:

- 1- Limited resources among ministerial and other PA staff that develops proposals that reflect their real needs.
- 2- The process of having a proposal to do a study takes time as the respective ministry will send the proposal to MoP and then MoP studies it and then send to the Attaché and finally a positive of negative response is given by the Attaché to the Ministry of Planning. The administrative way counts many steps and is extreme long in comparison with funds from other donors.
- **3-** The study fund is not well-known by a number of organizations in PA.
- **4-** Insufficient flexibility to adjust PA work realistically to the changes in the context due either to the project design, or because of its manner of implementation.

4.1 Overview of expenditure versus financial planning

In 2007 two studies were foreseen, one for civil defence, while the other was not defined at that time. An amount of 55,000 Euros was budgeted for the two studies; however nothing was spent in 2007 due to delays in approving the civil defence study and no proposal for another study was submitted to BTC by MOP.

5 MONITORING OF THE INDICATORS

5.1 Specific objective

The Specific Objective of the Study Fund is "Financing studies and consultancies including identification, preparation, follow up studies, investigation, missions, seminars, and services".

Five studies have been implemented, and one approved in 2007 and planned for 2008. Therefore the study fund is contributing to the achievement of its specific objective.

6 ASSESSMENT OF MONITORING CRITERIA

6.1 Efficiency

The project's activities are efficient, and the resources are well utilised. Activities could be carried more efficiently, and progress would have been noted if the recent political changes did not take place. However, the project continued despite all challenges and was quite flexible to deal with such changes.

6.2 Effectiveness

The studies implemented through the study fund serve the objective of the project. Studies are being funded and implemented through the Study Fund program. Suitability of the project can be improved by improving the process of soliciting proposals from Line Ministries to the Ministry of Planning.

6.3 Sustainability

The partner institution is taking over the management of the project to maintain in the sustainability.

7 MEASURES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

7.1 Overview of the assessment criteria

For the project "Palestinian-Belgium Study and Consultancy Funds" activities are efficient, effective and sustainable so, the action taken thus far should continue.

The process of having a proposal to do a study should be shorter.

The process can be enhanced through a better mechanism of solicitation of proposals by the Ministry of Planning and support of BTC.

The studies implemented through the study fund serve the objective of the project. They also contribute to the initiation of other projects in the PIC such as Health and Capacity Building of Ministry of Planning.
